Our Impact

How we help survivors of domestic abuse in our community:

- Individuals experiencing domestic abuse received 5.464 Emerge services.
- 7,133 Calls were made to Emerge's 24-hour multilingual Hotline.
- Emergency shelter bed nights were provided to 11,789 families.
- 2.199 People received community-based services.
- Men participated in the Men's Education Program, 396 including the Domestic Violence Orientation.

Here's what participants say about the impact of receiving services at Emerge:

- 97% of participants said their safety improved.
- 93% of participants said they regained control of their life.
- 95% of participants reported having increased self-sufficiency.
- 92% of participants reported having increased their knowledge of community resources and services.
- 86% of participants in our housing program exited to independent, permanent housing.

We are dedicated to educating our community about the dynamics of abuse and creating safety in Pima County.

215,000+ community members attended educational presentations related to domestic abuse and Emerge services.
